Hangi Procedure

- 1.Get the food ready.
- 2.Dig the hole.
- 3. Put the wood over the hole and the stones on the wood
- 4. Light the fire.
- 5. Keep the fire going to keep the stones hot.
- 6. Place the basket of meat, vegetables and steam pudding onto the hot stones.
- 7. Cover with a clean white sheet and then wet sacks/sugar bags.
- 8. Cover with the dirt from the hole making sure no steam is escaping
- 9. Keep watch because sometimes steam gets through and keep topping it with earth to prevent this
- 10. 3 hours later carefully remove dirt take off sugar bags remove baskets of kai cut up meat and dish up.
- 11. ENJOY.
