There will be surveys available at the disco for you to fill out if you haven't returned it by then.

Our BoT Chairman Craig Vanner and myself attended the **Tomorrow Schools Review** last Monday in Rotorua. This was a very informative and positive meeting about the proposed changes to our education system. The main discussion from this review was around the role a "Hub" would take. Hubs essentially would be in control of property and finance for the schools leaving the learning for the principals to drive. This would take a load off the principal and help them focus on education. I see this as a positive move but still have some reservations to how a hub would look like or work. The comfort is that if these changes were to take place this would be over a period of 3-5 years.

I am encouraging all our parents to join our **Skool Loop app.** This app gives us as a school instant notifications to parents of any event that may be cancelled, it also provides an opportunity for parents to return permission forms from the touch of a finger. Currently we have 32 people on Skool Loop.

Last Friday I met with Thea (Greening Taupo) & Natalie Haines (Mercury Energy) to discuss how our school could get involved in the Mangakowhiriwhiri Wetlands Restoration in Whakamaru Village. This was an exciting meeting with loads of opportunities and ideas that we will have to create some educational opportunities with this community project. WATCH THIS SPACE!!!

Our motivated school leaders have been busy organising our **School disco** for this term. This is to raise money to put towards their camp in term 2. For more information **see** the **Week 9 note** and check out the student designed **disco poster on page 4.** 

Our **Pouakani (Farm) Bus** will be running for the rest of the year and will so into the future. Next week we will be asking all parents whose children take this bus to attend a meeting at school.

Our country has shown an amazing amount of fortitude and strength through these trying times that makes one proud to be a New Zealander "we are one."

This week we have our School Disco on Friday night. Our school leaders will be running the whole event and will be raising funds for their camp in week two of term 2.


Juniors disco (y1-3) 5:00-7:00 Seniors disco (y4-8) 7:00-9:00 This disco is open to all primary aged students in our area.


"It's I! "Kaani the goat," said Kaani the goat,
