

### SORE THROATS

Did you know that sore throats can lead to a serious permanent disease called **RHEUMATIC FEVER**.

### What is ?

A serious preventable disease that can cause permanent heart damage.

### What causes rheumatic fever?

Strep throat (group A Streptococcus). This starts with a sore throat, but weeks later it may lead to joint pain, tiredness, fever or jerky movements. Heart damage can develop immediately or within a few months.

### How do I know if it is a Group A Strep bug?

You can only tell from getting a throat swab. If a child has a sore throat take them to get a free swab done at the GP, pharmacy, pathlab or after hours accident and medical centres.

### How can I prevent rheumatic fever?

If the throat swab is positive for Strep throat you will be given a course of antibiotics. If you take the full course of antibiotics it will stop Strep throat developing into rheumatic fever.

### Is Strep throat contagious?

YES and is spread through sneezing and coughing. To reduce spreading Strep A you must cover your mouth and wash your hands after coughing and sneezing.

### Who is most at risk?

- # children between 4 and 19 years old.
- # Maori and Pacific children.
- # People who have had family with rheumatic fever.
- # People who share a house with lots of other people.
