



#### National day of support for principals (Friday 9 August—Wear Green Day)

The teachers and support staff of Whakamaru School are joining with their colleagues all over the country on 9 August to call on the government to give primary and intermediate principals a fair deal. And we need your support as we stand up for our principal, and all principals

Teachers recently won pay parity with their secondary colleagues, because a teacher is a teacher, regardless of the age of their students. But the government refused to give primary and intermediate principals parity with principals of comparably sized secondary schools, or any support for growing workloads. In small schools, principals are doing a complex job but often without any extra support, and while teaching as well. And these principals are often paid less than some teachers in large schools.

We're calling on the Government to do the right thing by principals. It's only fair.

On Friday 9 August, we'll be <u>wearing green in support of principals</u> throughout New Zealand. Please come out and support the principals of New Zealand, who do such a vital job leading the teaching and learning in our school.



# Whakamaru School Heaviest Calf Competition



#### **Objective:**

To involve our school & farming community to help raise money towards helping to reduce the cost of the School Farm buses annual fee .

The Heaviest Calf competition involves each farm to voluntarily supply the school a fully weaned calf.

#### How it works:

Each farm will rear a calf to wean of your choice.

The farm will be provided with a white ear tag with Whakamaru School branded on it to help identify the calf or calves .

The idea is that each farm rears a calf in the spring . For the sake of fair competition the calf must be born between the  $20^{\circ}$  of July and no later than the  $30^{\circ}$  of August .

This ensures a reasonable animal can be provided for sale at the end.

Collection date would be late November, as that is when the last of the livestock sales are held.

Each calf will be picked up from the farms. EID read and put into a nominated NAIT number address for the ease of sales.

Each farm may need to provide their MBovis Bulk milk test letter of confirmation if need be .

When all calves are collected. They are put over the weigh scales and each weight is recorded.

Heaviest calf of that season wins and gloating rights are yours for the whole season.






#### Free ear clinic service for children Term 3.
