

All the others are notations of the same Ways-

I have three dogs of different ages. If I add their ages together, I get 15. If I multiply their ages together I get 45. How old are my dogs? 1 + 6 + 9 = 15 (9 and 6 are factors of 45 and 1 changes nothing in homestables.

The class was lined up in a way that the pattern of jerseys was: blue, blue, green, green, red, blue, blue, green, green, red...










