We are also focused on students well-being, fitness and ensuring our school has strong community connections. 

Our school logo

Our school logo as seen below is split into various parts.

At the top are five koru which represent the five KAAHU values.

Below these are the distinctive shape of the mountain range that the values are named from, Kaahu mountain which over looks our school.

The Waikato river snakes around the base of the mountain, water indicating the essence of life and the river regarded as a highly valued natural resource, requiring our protection.

From the river are three koru "our school", each koru representing Staff and Whanau (large koru) looking after students (small koru). This links to the English translation of Whakamaru, a shelter or safeguard.

Our colours are earthly with a maroon sky indicating how we always strive to reach for the top and green reinforcing the notion of growth and progress.

Farm Bus—Driver Charlie


(Whakamaru, 1 km down McDonald road, Mitchell, Scott—State Highway 30, Ranganui, McLean Roads)

PLEASE NOTE: the farm bus is a pay to use service, please contact the office to organise payments. If you have a question about bus routes then please ring the office to talk to our Office Manager. The Principal is in charge of the buses apart from that. If you need to discuss anything further then please ring the school and ask to speak to James.

Every child in the school who travels on the bus (including all Year 7 and 8 for Tech Arts students) are required to sign a Bus Code of Conduct form. There are senior children who are bus monitors that report daily to the Principal about bus behaviour. Good behaviour can be maintained by speaking to children about the schools and our expectations while using the bus.



<u>Classdojo</u>

Duffy Books

We are a Duffy Book School which means we receive lots of new books into the school. We give these books out to children at every opportunity – including when your child starts school, at assemblies and other special times as appropriate. We feel this recognises the importance reading and literacy development is placed at Whakamaru School.

Enviro-school

Enviroschools is a nationwide school programme that gives our students, staff and community an opportunity to learn about our environment. It also allows our school to use a network of schools who share and see innovative and inspiring ways to care for our planet, learn creatively and live healthy, sustainable lives.

Enrolments/Pre-School Visits

It is important that we know when your child is starting school so please ensure their name is on our list. New entrant children may have two school visits to familiarise themselves with their new surroundings. These are usually one morning and one afternoon in the week before their 5th birthday. Please contact Ms. Whatarau, through the school office, to organise visits. Parents must be on-site during these visits.

Please remember all new enrolments must be accompanied with a copy of a birth certificate or passport, immunization record and a record of their preschool education if they have one, as well as the completion of a range of forms in the enrolment packs.

Fonterra Milk

Food Programmes in Schools—Healthy Lunches in Schools programme

We are part of a range of food programmes that provide food here at school. This means we are lucky enough to have **Kickstart Breakfast club**, **Fruit in Schools & Healthy Lunches for Schools** for students to eat every day. We have fresh fruit delivered to the school . We also have "Healthy Lunches" supplied by Russmans Café delivered to school each lunchtime. We encourage all of our students to eat the healthy food supplied by Russmans. Note: please let us know if your child has any dietary requirements.

Gardening Club—Enviro-team

We have opportunities for students to take part in the garden/envoiro-teams where they have a say in how the school grounds are developed and created.











Kapa Haka

All students take part in our weekly Kapa Haka session. Students will be taking part in performances throughout the year as our Māori culture is an integral part of school. Our students all take part in our whole school Kapa Haka group. We practice each week for events or pōwhiri.

Every year Whakamaru School attends a performance festival either in Tokoroa (The South Waikato Cultural Festival) or Taupō (Taiopenga o Tuwharetoa festival) on alternative years. These events are the highlights of the school year.

Library

We have a library on-site which every child has the opportunity to use weekly during class time. We believe it is extremely important that students have access to physical books to read. We also have software which means students can access the catalogue and records remotely from home or at school. See our school website—click on 'About Us' then 'School Library' to see our catalogue.

Mangakowhirwhiri Restoration

We are involved in the restoration of our community wetlands Mangakowhirwhiri project along side Mercury Energy. This gives our students opportunities to plant native flora and fauna, trapping and tracking pests in this area etc. We are working closely with Mercury, Greening Taupō and Enviroschools to help beautify our community.

Maunga events

Whakamaru School have Maunga Ropu which are Tauhara (yellow), Titiraupenga (red), Pureora (green) and Tongarero (blue). These maunga compete in a range of school competitions such as quizzes, challenges, sports events etc, for points for their maunga ropu.

Students can also gain valuable Maunga points through our award system—KAAHU cards for displaying the KAAHU values. These are tallied up to see who is the top Maunga for each term and the overall top maunga of the year who receives the Maunga Shield at the end of the year.

Newsletters (fortnightly)

Newsletters are sent home with the eldest or only child fortnightly usually on a Wednesday afternoon. Please take the time to read it as it will provide you with information about what has and is happening at school. We are more than happy to add any advertisement or community news you may want us to if space allows, just contact our school office if you have something.

Parent Help

It is important to us that we develop positive partnership between home and school. We encourage you to be involved in your child's schooling. Parent help is always hugely appreciated. Gardening, reading with children, art, etc – all offers are gratefully received. Please talk to your child's class teacher if you are able to help in anyway.

Performing Arts

Staff, children and parents all enjoy being involved in school shows. The children build confidence and skills across all aspects of producing and directing a school show and showcase their talents. We also provide an opportunity for students to learn how to play the guitar and possibly piano should there be interest. These are run by special tutors who come to school to teach students how to play these instruments weekly. If your child is interested please contact the office, note: this is a private service and comes with a small charge.

PMP –Perceptual Motor Programme

Whakamaru School staff believe that a child's early school years are the foundations for launching into lifetime of learning.

We understand that bridging the gap between a playful world of preschool and the different expectations of the primary classroom is important. We work closely with Kiwi Steps (Early Childhood Centre) to gain valuable partnerships with children. PMP is a special way to bridge that gap. PMP is a movement / language development programme that focuses on motor coordination, cognitive development (brain), self-esteem and social skills which develops the students ability to cope better in the classroom situation.

This development is necessary for success in the early years of school. When children move they learn. We run this fun challenging programme twice a week in term two.

P.T.A.—Parent-Teacher- Association (reignited)

Over the years a very small supportive group of parents and caregivers organized some fantastic events. We were lucky to have this group backing our school and raising funds for different aspects of the school. We would love to get this group up and running again so think about what you can do to be involved and help start this group up again. Reading Together

Reading together is a research based workshop programme for parents, children, teachers and librarians. It helps parents effectively to support their children's reading at home .

Reading together consists of four workshops for parents/caregivers which are lead by the teacher.

Reading Together continued:

How to help with reading at home.

How to check the difficulty level of reading materials.

How to help children overcome problems in their reading.

How to keep up support at home.

Many adults have found the information in the workshops helpful. They find that their children's reading



School Pool

We are lucky enough to have a heated school pool. All teachers are trained in the Swim Safe Instruction Programme and are qualified to teach swimming. Please make sure that your child has their togs and towel at school during the swimming season in term 1 & 4. It is expected that all students take part in our school swimming programme. If due to sickness, they cannot swim, then please make sure they have a note. There are consequences for non-swimmers as this is a big part of our Curriculum - Physical Education. Our school pool is also available for our community so if you would like to purchase a key to use after school, in the weekends or school holidays, please contact our School Office.

School Uniform

Our uniform consists of a maroon polo (you can order & buy from school) and any type black shorts, trackpants, tights or trousers. The Board of Trustees have agreed to buy your child's first polo. Hoodies are optional and can be ordered from the office, please be aware that orders take up to 8 –10 weeks to receive. Cost of polo's—\$30 & Hoodies \$60.

Skool Loop

We encourage all our parents to join our Skool Loop app. This app gives us as a school instant notifications to parents of any event that may be cancelled, it also provides an opportunity for parents to notify the school with any absentees and return permission forms from your mobile phone by a touch of a finger. Skool Loop is also linked to our Classdojo app so communication should be easier.

Stationery

All supplies can be purchased from the school, where costs are kept to a minimum. A stationery notice will go home with your child after their first few days of school so students can use some of their current or any old books in the meantime. It is important that your child is ready to learn with the appropriate stationery.

Student Council & Maunga Leaders

Each year the Student Council & Maunga Leaders are selected by the teachers and students. Students who are positive, responsible role models are chosen for these valued position.

This group meets weekly to discuss school matters and organise special days so children feel they have a real say in what happens at our school.







Sunhats

Children must have a hat at school during Terms 1 and 4. During this time they will be expected to sit under the shade sails (in front of the classes) if they do not have one. This means they cannot play on the playground or on the playing fields.

Technology Classes

All Year 7 and 8 students attend Technology classes at Forest View High School in Tokoroa. This is held every Thursday morning. The bus leaves school at 8:30am sharp, then returns at 11:00am. There is no charge for transport by bus but there are associated course fees which the Board of Trustees subsidises. Students may also be expected to supply some ingredients for Food Technology.

Te Reo Māori lessons for the community

There maybe another opportunity for Te Reo Māori lessons at school this year. It is open to our community one weekday evening from 6:00-8:00. This is full funded by REAP—Taupō. Keep an eye on our school newsletter for further information.

Visitors

All visitors to the school are welcome and should report to the school office first to sign in on arrival and use our vistors tablet to do so.

Week day /weekend sports

We have soccer and netball teams that play in competitions in Tokoroa over the winter months and a basketball team that plays in Taupō, throughout the year . Please be aware this is dependant on numbers interested. These are run and supported by our wonderful community with trainings taking place at school. Other sports available locally, are rugby league with the Mangakino Hawkes and rugby run by clubs in Tokoroa or Taupō.

Whakamaru Sports opportunities

Every year we join other schools in a range of sporting events, including swimming, folk dancing, winter sports, cross country and athletics. **Kiwi** Sport run events in Taupō which we attend as well such as Rippa-rugby, Tee-ball, basketball etc. They also provide taster sessions termly at Whakamaru School to encourage students to try a sport.

Any athletes who show outstanding sporting ability are invited to compete in a range of Taupō or Waikato Full Primary Schools sporting events such as swimming, cross country and athletics to challenge our students further.
